Dear members of IRAHSSE, Dear colleagues,

In September 2023, the 7th Conference of IRAHSSE will take place in Cologne, Germany. Colleagues who cannot attend physically are now also welcome to participate online.

The conference's goals are:

Goals To shed light on national, international, and interdisciplinary relationships in research on History, Geography and Social Sciences education, and to foster research collaborations, including international and interdisciplinary collaboration.

These goals shall be reached by promoting scientific exchanges on issues organized along four different axes:

Axes

- 1. Institutional frameworks of History, Geography and Social Sciences Education: Here we are particularly interested in better understanding traditional structures and institutional organization of education, schools, teacher training, etc. either existing structures of education or didactic research or perspectives for the future organization of education and research.
- 2. Research filiations in History, Geography and Social Sciences Education: Via this axis, we would like to explore and compare traditions and schools in scientific communities, both at national and international levels.
- 3. International networks in History, Geography and Social Sciences Education: The focus of this axis is on existing cooperation projects in didactic research or in the organization of education (e.g. teacher training).
- 4. Interdisciplinary research on History, Geography and Social Sciences Education: This axis's emphasis is on already existing research associations or

projected ones, especially those for which cooperation can be formed during the conference.
